He later moved to 25 Aberdeen Park, Highbury and 114-117 Cock Hill, Ratcliff East.</p> <p>Related Material: Stride and Son, auction house, sold a related archive of letters, documents, diaries, ephemera and photographs relating to Commander James Cantrell Johnstone Soutter (2 boxes). Lot 530, Auction Date: 13 November 2024. According to the Auction House, 'Soutter was born in 1885, appointed Senior Lieutenant on the cruiser Amethyst: in 1915 Amethyst was attacked and 22 of her crew were killed. In helping steer the damaged cruiser, Soutter was mentioned in dispatches and promoted to Lieutenant Commander, later seeing action at Jutland. 	<p>or by default hazarded Tourmaline and Splendid. The charge was proven and he was severely reprimanded. He continued to serve and during WWII was appointed in command of the armed yacht Evadne. 	<p>Description: To her husband, Richard, whilst he was away on business at Hartlepool. However, some of the first letters are written whilst she is away in Nottinghamshire and Boulogne, France and addressed to 49 Lower Shadwell. She writes twice on Christmas Eve 1845, also enclosing a request for some "pecuniary assistance" from William Hancock of Corby Square. On 5 December 1845 two notes are also enclosed to Richard, one from Mary's sister, Eliza, and one from his daughter, Mary Silvia Soutter.</p> <p>Cover family and business matters, local events and other details. Examples [transcribed from the letter before their purchase and deposit]:</p> <p>'Guano fetched a very good price last week and it is expected will now find a ready sale. At Liverpool £7,15 for Ichiha. What do you mean to do about the Fame. Is it better for her to remain in the docks".</p> <p>"Robert is very original...yesterday he had some sprats and wished to know if they were the large fishes babies".</p> <p>"The entertainment at the Concert was much better than one could expect for the money.
